Introduction Session:  
Labour market statistics is one of the key macro indicator that plays a pivotal role in a nation's socioeconomic development. These statistics are compiled, analysed and disseminated by the national Statistical Offices (NSOs) and National Statistical Systems (NSSs) of various countries to facilitate decision making processes by policy-makers and enterprises/agencies. In 2020, the COVID-19 public health crisis had affected the business operations and subsequently caused imbalances in labour market conditions. In this regard, the needs for data has become even more crucial to address the multiple labour market concerns resulting from the pandemic. The NSOs are facing numerous challenges to fulfil growing demands for granular and almost real-time labour statistics and health protection statistics. Thus, this session aims to gain insights on the responses and reactions of NSOs and HOs as well as to discuss creative solutions and practices incorporating models and methods of data collection, analysis and dissemination.

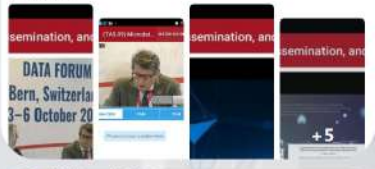

- To promote the open data. In particular access and use of microdata as a way to boost analytical research and knowledge of management.
- To provide segregating data for addressing critical development challenges such as poverty, gender inequality, food insecurity.
- Content information as at individual level, multidimensional view of the needs of the vulnerable people that is essential design for targeting programmes and policies.
- Microdata are global public goods. The data collection should be disseminated by official statistics agencies to all the citizen for public information. However individuals data should be kept strictly confidential and use exclusively for statistical purposes.

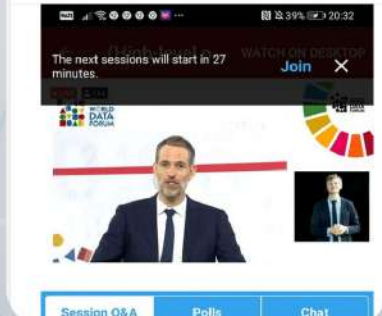

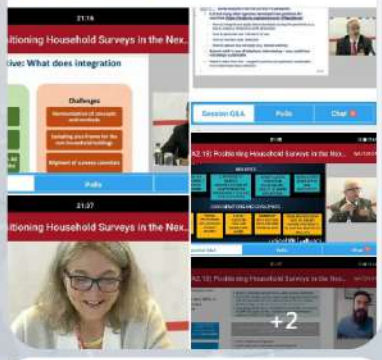

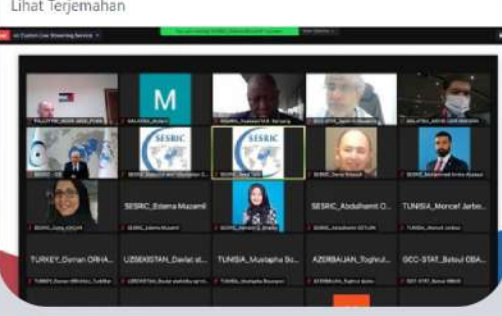

The discourse on open data now focuses on how, not if open data should be implemented. A decade after the launch of the open data movement, many countries have launched significant open data programs. Beyond using open data for government transparency – the goal that motivated the movement in the beginning – governments, civil society and private-sector partners are using open data to inform their response to COVID-19, as well as support advances in healthcare, agriculture, transportation, education, energy, finance, climate mitigation and resilience, and other areas that are essential to sustainable development. While open data's value is now broadly recognized, the issues in using it have also become more clear. The use of open data has brought issues of data privacy, quality, interoperability, and governance into high relief, and required data stewards to develop new solutions. Recognizing these issues, Open data's proponents now work on strategies for sharing data in controlled ways as well as opening it fully. The open data movement has become more sophisticated, and has turned towards exploring how countries can harness the benefits of open data to achieve more strategic goals, such as using open data to promote data interoperability for SDG reporting, increasing data sharing with and between non-government data providers, and overall expanding the use, value, and impact of data. The proposed session, Beyond Open Data: What's next for the movement?, will bring together data experts to discuss the evolution of the open data movement.

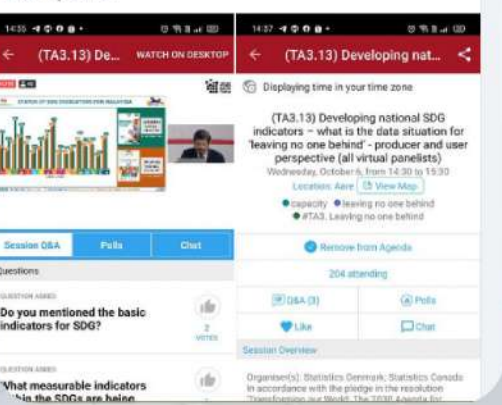
