






Chart 1: Groop Enrotment Rate (GER) by use, Malzycia, 2019

Alarmingly low attention paid to equality measures

- Alternative, family-friendly working time models (7,6%)
- · Regulations against gender discrimination (6,5%)
- · Support in the period before and after childbirth (3,4%)
- Substantial differences between sectors: Public administration (61%) v.s. Construction (9%)
- Discrepancy between Blau scores: Average heterogeneity on websites is 40% higher compared to the executive level.


