OBJECTIVE 1

To provide accurate estimates of labor force statistics at the national and regional levels (urban and rural).


METHOD OF COLLECTION











DISTRIBUTION OF EMPLOYED PERSONS BY EMPLOYMENT STATUS ('000)

DISTRIBUTION OF EMPLOYED PERSONS BY ETHNIC GROUP ('000)





DISTRIBUTION OF UNEMPLOYED PERSONS BY WORK EXPERIENCE AND STRATA





Urban = Metropolitan + Urban Large

Rural = Urban Small + All Rural


The unemployed who had worked before had a higher percentage than those who had never worked for both strata with 68.8% in Urban and 61.9% in Rural respectively.
