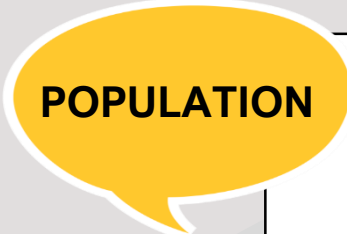




CURRENT POPULATION ESTIMATES, ADMINISTRATIVE DISTRICTS, 2022

This Current Population Estimates, Administrative Districts, 2022 presents mid-year population estimates by age group, ethnic group and gender at the administrative district level. This data has been revised based on the Population and Housing Census of Malaysia, 2020 and takes into account the current annual birth, death, international migration records using administrative data sources from related agencies. Meanwhile, internal migration is based on the Migration Survey by Department of Statistic, Malaysia (DOSM).

The current population estimates are prepared using the bottom-up approach where the population is estimated according to administrative districts, state, single age, ethnic group and sex. The total population of Malaysia and state is the summation of all administrative district population estimates. The mid-year population estimates data for 2022 is a preliminary. Input components for births, deaths, internal migration and international migration are estimates and will be finalized once the latest information is received and updated.

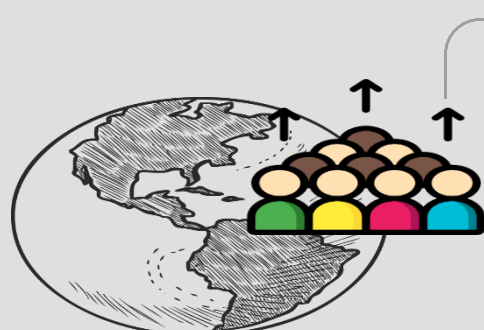


The basic formula of cohort-component method is as follows:

$$P_t = P_{(t-1)} + B_t - D_t + M_t$$

where;

- P_t = population at time t;
- $P_{(t-1)}$ = population at time t-1;
- B_t = births at time t;
- D_t = deaths at time t; and
- M_t = net migration at time t.

Malaysia's total population in 2022 was 32.7 million as compared to 32.6 million in 2021. Malaysia's population grew at a slower rate of 0.2 per cent annually for the period 2021 to 2022 as compared to 0.4 per cent in 2020 to 2021.

The administrative districts with the highest population numbers are **Petaling, Selangor (2.3 million), W.P. Kuala Lumpur (2.0 million) and Johor Bahru, Johor (1.7 million).**

Chart 1: Highest number of population by administrative district, Malaysia, 2022^P

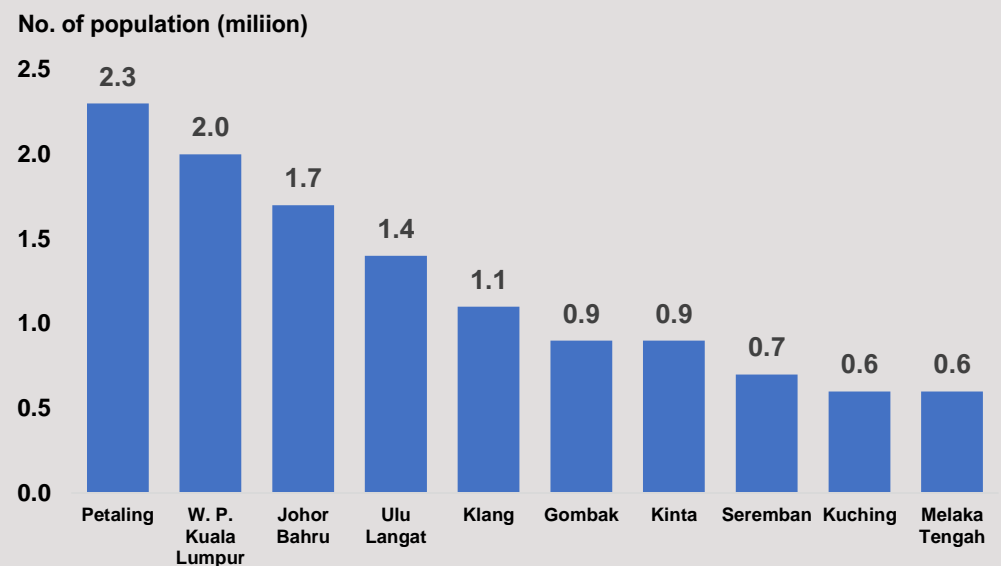
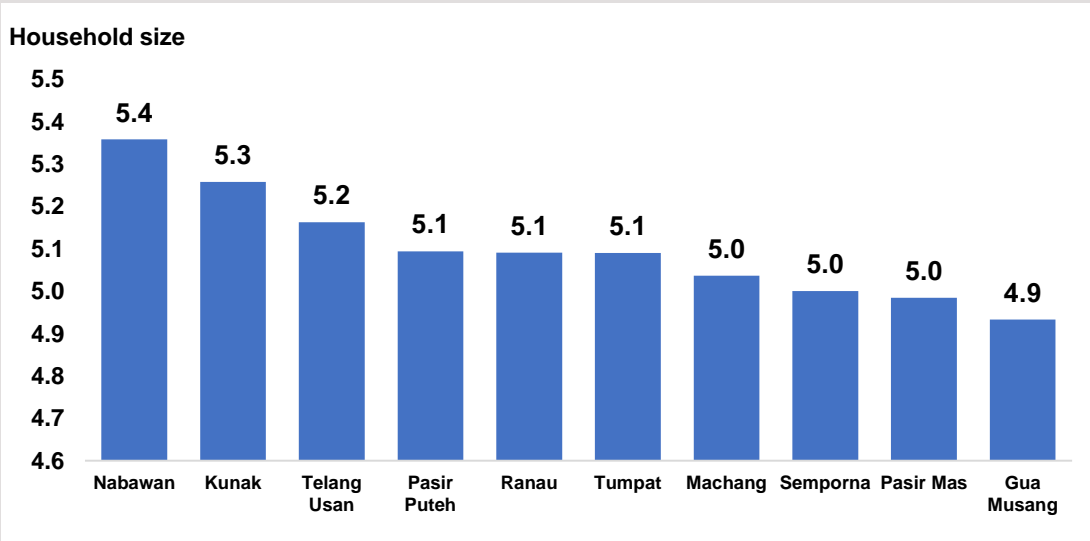


Chart 2: Highest average household size by administrative district, Malaysia, 2022^P



The average household size in Malaysia is 3.8 with the highest recorded in **Kelantan (4.9), Sabah (4.4) and Terengganu (4.0).** Three (3) of the 156 administrative districts recorded an **average household size below 3.0, namely Sepang, Selangor (2.9), Sebauh (2.8) and Matu (2.7) located in Sarawak.**

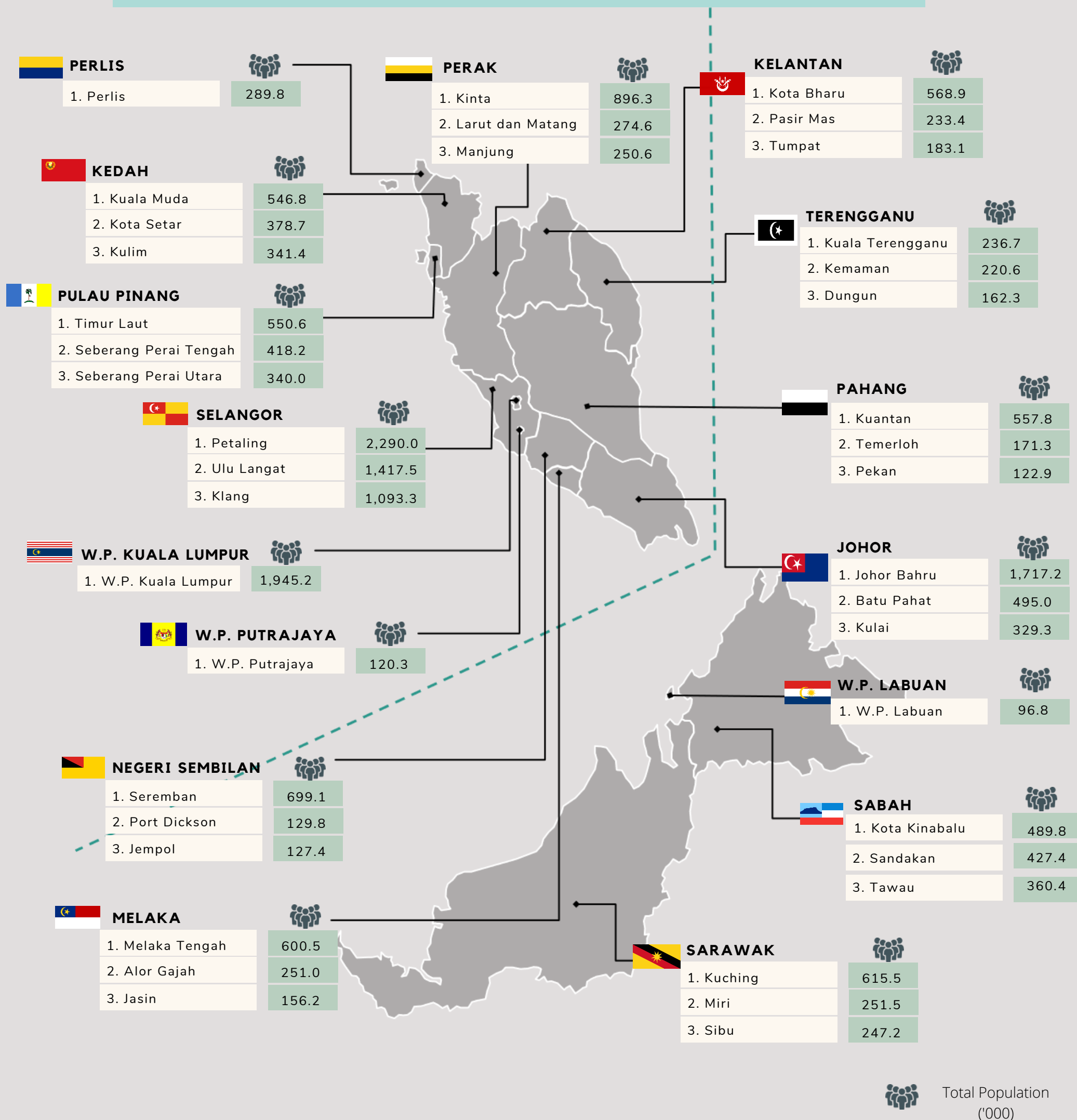
