HISTORY

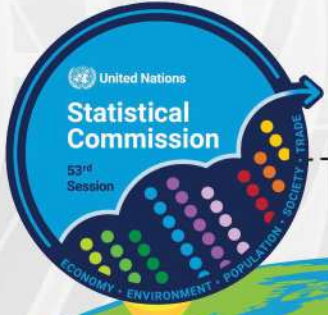
- Established in 1947 (75 years).
- 193 countries that are member countries of the UN.
- 2 countries as non-member countries serve as observers which are the Holy See & the State of Palestine.
- The Bureau of the StatCom consists of 24 member countries, elected by the ECOSOC based on geographical distribution.

ROLES

- Apex for Global Statistical System (GSS) that oversees the work of the UNSD and is a Functional Commission of the UN ECOSOC.
- Act as the highest decision-making body for international statistical activities, responsible for setting of statistical standards and the development of concepts and methods, including their implementation at the national and international level.
- Bringing together the Chief Statisticians from more than 195 countries and the International Organisation from around the world in annual basis.

CURRENT UNSC

- The 53rd UNSC (#UN53SC) was held from 28th Feb until 2nd March 2022 & 4th March 2022 virtually due to the COVID-19 pandemic.
- Ms. Gabriella Vukovich from Hungary is the Chair of #UN53SC.
- More than 300 delegations from over 100 nations joined #UN53SC virtually.

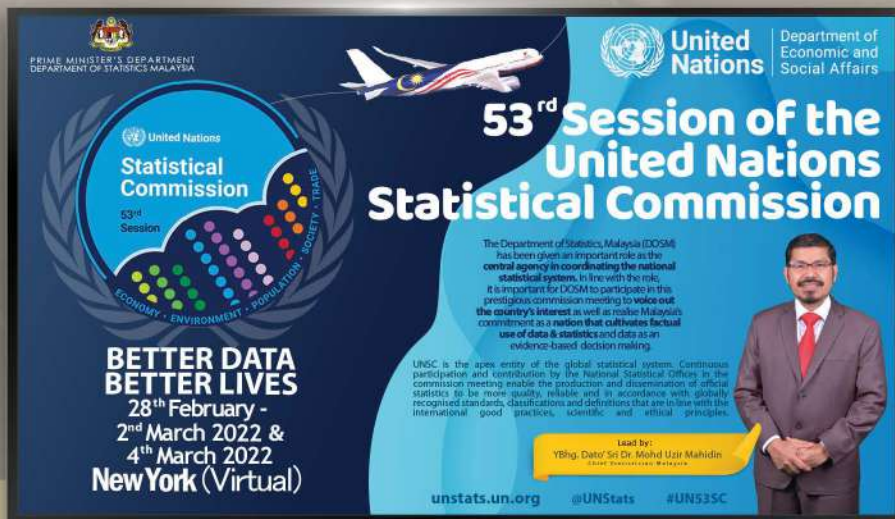

Highlights at #UN53SC

Dr. Uzir asserted that "The continued involvement will ensure full alignment with global statistical standards in order to expand coverage, relevance, timeliness as well as comparable data and statistics that are in line with international good practices, scientific and ethical principles. **DOSM as the central agency for official national statistics will continue to be actively involved and supportive** in order to improve coverage of many vital statistical indicators as well as to provide reliable official statistics that are relevant to the policy that will benefit the whole National Statistical System and the well-being of society."

Malaysia proposed that, communication regarding data request and verification of estimated data by Custodian Agencies/ UN Agencies with countries should involve National Statistics Offices (NSOs) to ensure the consistency of data reported at global and national platform.

02

Malaysia called for and encouraged the use of ICT and digitisation to modernise the population and housing census, citing Malaysia's achievements and successes in implementing the Malaysia Population and Housing Census 2020 (MyCensus 2020) at a critical moment when many countries had postponed its implementation.

03

Malaysia welcomes the adoption of the 50-year Statistical Commissions Terms of Reference (ToR).

04

Malaysia agrees on the need to harmonise the SEEA Central Framework and updated 2008 SNA. Malaysia supports the collaboration between the Committee, the Advisory Expert Group on National Accounts and the Inter-secretariat Working Group on National Accounts.

05

Malaysia acknowledges the collection of e-waste indicators as an important aspect of ICT statistics. Malaysia looks forward to participating in the capacity-building training programmes especially related to the best practices of ICT statistics and big data for ICT statistics.

06

Malaysia strongly believes that a good practice in data stewardship is fundamental to providing high-quality data that is consistent and easily accessible.

07

Malaysia appreciates the effort of Statistics Division and expert group on proposed plans to finalise the guidelines and builds country capacity in the area of time-use statistics and provide guidance to integrate a gender perspective item of the commission.

08

Malaysia in the midst of strengthening the production of agriculture statistics and developing selective agriculture index. Going forward Malaysia will undertake Agriculture Census in 2024 which would cover both household and established involve in agriculture production. Malaysia Statistical Business Register (MSBR) will update the frame for the establishment. Meanwhile for the household will be based on Population Census 2020 with filtering question regarding the household involvement in agriculture sector.

09

Malaysia also agrees with the inclusion of Agriculture activities in measuring informal sector. In this regards, the national analysis on informal sector has also been expanded by incorporating the Agriculture activities to reflect comprehensive insights of informal sector employment considering the nature of Agriculture activities which largely involved smallholders, unstructured and lack of social protection.

Malaysia suggests that the updated 2008 SNA explains explicitly on the treatment of emerging economy such as gig economy, sharing economy, shadow economy and blue economy in view of the national accounts compilation.

“ In order for National Statistics Offices to secure financing for data and statistics, they need to become competitive, visible and proactive to actively pursuing mobilization of domestic resources and become better on communicating and explaining their roles. ”

“ The Quality Assurance Framework (QAF) is a methodology for quality management that is both coherent and thorough. The Statistical outputs have a variety of properties, including relevance, accuracy and reliability; timeliness and punctuality; accessibility and clarity; coherence and comparability. ”

“ The revision of the International Trade Manuals is timely and important to ensure international trade statistics remain accurate and relevant to the users. DOSM is proud to be part of the task team which involve in that revision. ”

BPPA

“ Develop an assessment tool to evaluate the quality of available data and explore the use of Non-Traditional Data Sources to produce official statistics (SDG and Non-SDG). Improve capacity building for data quality stewardship in DOSM for non-traditional data. The use of non-traditional data can provide several advantages to the NSOs in producing various official statistics at the smallest level. ”

“ The Statistical Performance Indicators will complement the United Nations' National Quality Assurance Frameworks Manual for Official Statistics and National Strategies for the Development of Statistics by PARIS21 which currently have been used to assess countries' statistical capacity. We look forward to implement best practices of SPI to strengthen national's statistical capacity. ”

“ UNSD-FCDO project aimed at monitoring the SDGs has helped 20 countries in Asia and Africa measure the achievement of the SDGs effectively through the development of national data, metadata and SDG platform as well as improved coordination, increasing data sharing and awareness of data. ”

“ The UN Inter-Agency and Expert Group on the SDG Indicators (IAEG-SDGs) describes its two-year process to develop a replacement indicator for SDG target 17.3 (Mobilize additional financial resources for developing countries from multiple sources). The Group describes specific financing flows to be covered through six sub-indicators: Official sustainable development grants; Official concessional sustainable development loans; Official concessional sustainable development loans; Foreign direct investment; Mobilized private finance; and Private grants. ”

“ The use of MPI that includes a non-monetary dimension can help identify the poverty level of the people more thoroughly beside the income dimension. Furthermore, MPI can also assist the Government in identifying areas of concern that need attention instead of income. 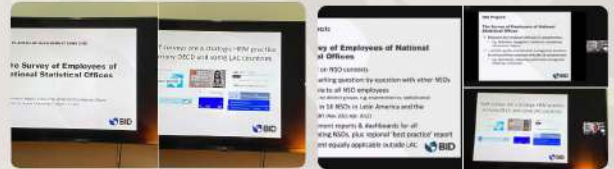

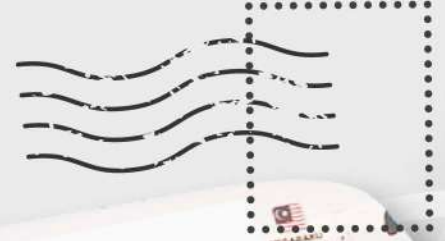

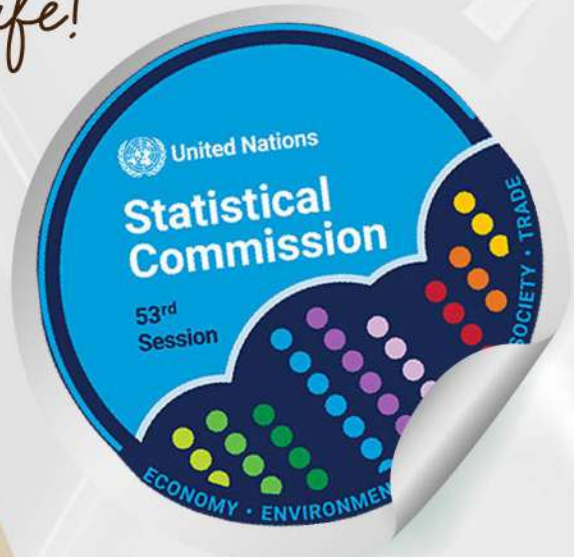
